The School of Graduate Studies partners with Ohio State University through the ETD Center—a free, online repository. It contains the abstract and full-text of the most current research occurring in the field.

The ETD Center is freely accessible worldwide to all theses and dissertations published in Ohio. Using a basic keyword search, authors, university affiliation, and keywords can be used to find a document.

When you submit your ETD to OhioLINK, you are making your ETD available for open access on the Internet, including for use in OhioLINK's Open Access Journals.

Points to Consider Prior to Submitting Your ETD

All copyrighted material (e.g. previously published articles, journal, monograph or chapter) that you have already published or plan to publish in a journal or book should not be included in the completed ETD. Students cannot alter published figures.

Inclusion of any intellectual property of a collaborator must be appropriately considered. Data from collaborators should not be included in the ETD.

All information in the ETD will be put into the public domain. If you plan to publish a portion of the ETD in a journal or book in the future, you must request an embargo on the ETD to allow for future publication of your ETD. Check the publisher's policies (e.g. Elsevier in a journal, you can later include the ETD in a book).
