## State of Michigan Workers' Disability Compensation Agency

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You are entitled to reasonable and necessary medical care for work-related injuries or diseases. Employers or their insurance carriers are required by law to provide these services. During the rst 28 days of treatment, your employer has the right to choose the physician. After 28 days you are free to change physicians, but you must notify your employer of the change. If you receive treatment from a physician of your choice, you shall obtain and promptly furnish a report to your employer.

If your employer refuses to provide medical care, you should contact Michigan's Workers' Disability Compensation Agency at its toll-free telephone number: **1-888-396-5041**.

You should not receive a bill from a health care provider for treatment of a covered work-related injury or illness. If you do receive such a bill, you should contact your employer or the employer's insurance carrier.

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You are entitled to weekly workers' compensation bene to if you sufer a wage loss for more than seven consecutive days. These bene to may be claimed as long as a disability and wage loss continue. Generally, the bene to rate is 80% of your after-tax average weekly wage, subject to a maximum rate.

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If you are unable to perform the work that you have done previously, you are entitled to vocational rehabilitation. The number one goal is your return to work with your employer. If you cannot do this or require assistance in nding a new job, vocational rehabilitation services can help.
